



Commissioner Henry P. Roybal is a life-long resident of the Pojoaque Valley and has resided in El Rancho his entire life. Commissioner Roybal has dedicated his life to serving the community, from coaching little league to serving as a Santa Fe County Commissioner. In his early days as a budding community leader he was President for the Young American Football League, President of the Pojoaque Valley Little League, Head Coach of the Pojoaque Valley Junior High School Football Team, and the Assistant Coach of the Pojoaque Valley High School Football Team.

Commissioner Roybal and his wife Marlene have 3 children, Amber 26, Alyssa 25 and Henry, Jr 21, all growing up in El Rancho and attending Pojoaque Valley School District.

Commissioner Roybal received a degree in Electronic Packaging, Design and Electromechanical Engineering Design from Northern New Mexico Community College. His career consists of 23 years of experience in State and Federal government and is currently employed by Los Alamos National Laboratory.

First elected as Santa Fe County Commissioner for District 1 beginning January, 2015, Commissioner Roybal was later re-elected for an additional 4-year term, beginning, January 2019. In addition, to the duties and responsibilities of an elected official, Commissioner Roybal currently serves on the Buckman Direct Diversion Board, Santa Fe Metropolitan Policy Organization, Regional Coalition of the Los Alamos National Laboratory Communities Board, Santa Fe Solid Waste Management Agency, the County Investment Committee, and County Housing Authority. In addition, Commissioner Roybal sits as a Board Director for the New Mexico Associations of Counties, lead CEO for the Northern Area Local Workforce Development Board, and is the Chairman of the Santa Fe County 2020 Census Committee.
